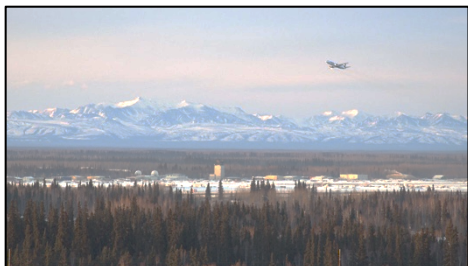

5-Day Land Tour

FAIRBANKS



Welcome to Fairbanks. Whether you're exploring Alaska's Golden Heart City or the wonderful amenities your hotel has to offer, get ready for an unforgettable journey in the days ahead. Please note that the standard hotel check-in time is 3:00 pm. Guests who arrive earlier may have to wait to occupy their rooms.

*The transfer from Airport to Hotel is included when arriving flight information is provided to Norwegian Cruise Line at least 10 days prior to tour start date. Transfer is offered only on the starting date of the tour. Guests who do not provide flight information within the guidelines forfeit this service. Unused transfers are non-refundable.

FAIRBANKS



This morning enjoy a cruise on the Riverboat Discovery, a three-hour journey that will take you into the heart of Alaska. Operated by a family who has made the Alaskan rivers home for five generations, you'll witness a Bush Pilot take off and land beside the boat and hear stories of flying into remote Alaska firsthand. Halfway through the experience, you'll be immersed in frontier living with a guided walking tour of a re-created Athabascan Indian village. See cabins made of spruce logs, along with indigenous dwellings that have allowed the strong Athabascan people to survive for thousands of years in this harsh environment. Afterwards, board your deluxe motorcoach for a city tour of Fairbanks before stopping in historic downtown for lunch on your own. This tour includes a stop at the Trans-Alaska Oil Pipeline and gives you a great overview of the Fairbanks community. Open afternoon and evening to explore Fairbanks or take an optional tour.

FAIRBANKS / DENALI NATIONAL PARK & PRESERVE



This morning, board your deluxe motorcoach to travel to Denali National Park. More than just a mountain, Denali National Park is six million acres of wild land. After lunch on your own, your tour will take you into this pristine region of Alaska on the only road into and out of the park. Along the way, enjoy a fully narrated ride learning about the flora and fauna of the area while looking out for the wild animals that roam freely and call this park home. While in this beautiful area, set aside time to experience the solitude and tranquility that vast wilderness can provide.

After this authentic visit, we won't be surprised if you are ready to run "The Last Great Race" yourself. Late morning, continue south by motorcoach to the town of Talkeetna. Continue on your journey south while traveling along the rails of the world-famous Alaska Railroad from Talkeetna to Anchorage in a deluxe dome railcar. Full bar and meal service are available for purchase during your rail journey.

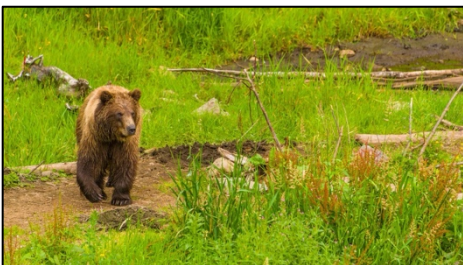
SEATTLE, WASHINGTON



Seattle sits on the slip of land between Puget Sound and Lake Washington, with the Olympic and Cascade Mountains serving as a dramatic backdrop for this oh-so cosmopolitan city. Soar up the futuristic Space Needle and experience the views atop this stunning landmark created for the 1962 World's Fair.

Sitka, AK

BEST OF SITKA

Activity Level: Moderate

DETAILS:

This unique Alaska excursion explores the historical highlights of this former “Russian” capital city and includes a wildlife tour through the Alaska Raptor Center. The Raptor Center operates with bird care professionals assisted by volunteers to rescue birds, provide them with rehabilitative care and hopefully release them back into the wild. After your introduction to the center, a presentation with one of the Center’s educational birds will take place. Time will be available to view the flight center, clinic window, outside deck habitat areas and gift shop.

Next, you’ll visit the Sitka National Historical Park, where the 1804 “Battle of Alaska”, was fought. The park hosts totem lined trails, cultural exhibits and carving rooms where native Alaskan artisans demonstrate their totemic art form. Walk the nature trail, view cultural exhibits, and video presentation, or talk with native artists about their cultural art form.

The final stop is visiting the Fortress of the Bears, which allows you to get within 25 feet of Alaska’s brown and black bears in a naturalized setting. You will enjoy observing 3 populations of bears from a covered viewing platform and interact with an experienced naturalist.

NOTES:

- Tour order may be reversed.
- At the end of your tour, you will be dropped off in town to continue to explore Sitka on your own.
- There is a shuttle service that operates every 10 minutes to return you to the ship.
- Wear layered clothing, light rain jacket and comfortable walking shoes.
- Lift buses are not able to accommodate Motorized Scooters, however manual wheelchairs can be used.

TASTE OF SITKA

DETAILS:

Discover fascinating aspects of the native wildlife and local culture at Sitka Sound Science Center, and then return to Sitka sample a selection of local craft beers. The science center is a great place to learn about the marine creatures indigenous to these waters. After your educational visit at the science center, a quick drive will take you to a scenic photo stop at the University of Alaska. Your guide will share about how the university was a military base and airfield during WW2. Following your historical immersion, you will head to the Channel Club restaurant for a light salmon meal and tasting of beers made with local ingredients.

NOTES:

- Tour order may vary due to scheduling.
- At the end of the tour, all guests will be dropped off in town to explore Sitka on their own.
- A shuttle runs every 10 minutes back to the pier when the ship is docked.
- Wear layered clothing, light rain jacket and comfortable walking shoes.

- Lift buses are not able to accommodate Motorized Scooters, however manual wheelchairs can be used.

Juneau, AK

MENDENHALL GLACIER, HATCHERY & GARDENS

DETAILS:

This tour combines the splendor of visiting Mendenhall Glacier Recreation Area with a comfortable trip into the rainforest at Glacier Gardens. Your journey begins with a visit to Alaska's most accessible glacier, the Mendenhall. There you will be able to view the glacier, tour the adjacent visitor center, and explore the outlying trails and viewpoints during your 75 minute stay. Next you're off to Glacier Gardens where you'll board a guided tram vehicle and climb up through the temperate rainforest to a scenic viewing platform that offers alpine views of the surrounding mountains, waterways and islands. Upon your return to the base area, you'll have time to visit the Gardens pavilion and view the variety of botanical plants that thrive in the local climate. Finally, you'll visit the Macaulay Salmon Hatchery and learn about the facility's positive impact on Alaska's prized fishing industry through the implementation of ocean ranching.

NOTES:

- This tour operates under a special use permit issued by the U.S. Forest Service.
- Wheelchair access may be limited, please call 1.866.625.1167 for assistance.
- Guests who go ashore do so with the understanding that they will be mixing with members of the general public.
- Lift buses are not able to accommodate Motorized Scooters, however manual wheelchairs can be used.

MOUNTAINTOP FOREST TRAM

DETAILS:

Ride a state-of-the-art window-walled gondola to the top of Hoonah Mountain and then board an open-air tram for an inspiring ride through an old-growth forest. The views will be spectacular in every

direction as you ascend the mountain, which rises more than a quarter mile above the sea. The wheeled tram will offer a closer look at the natural world as it winds through the woods for about six miles. The towering stands of Sitka spruce and western hemlock are a wonder to behold. The significance of the forest becomes even clearer as your guide describes the delicate balance of its biodiversity and fascinating geology. Wildlife is abundant and it's not uncommon to spot Sitka black-tailed deer and bald eagles. You will also enjoy sweeping views of the Port Frederick Inlet, Spasski River Valley, glacially carved reflecting ponds and beautiful bogs known as muskegs.

HIGHLIGHTS:

Take in the breathtaking views while riding an aerial gondola up Hoonah Mountain.
Ride an open-air tram through a dense forest while the guide describes the flora and fauna. Look for wildlife such as Sitka black-tailed deer and bald eagles.

HELPFUL HINTS:

- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

NOTES:

- This tour is available to wheelchair guests.

Ketchikan (Ward Cove), AK

SAXMAN NATIVE VILLAGE & LUMBERJACK SHOWS

Activity Level: Easy

DETAILS:

Become absorbed in the rich culture of Southeast Alaska's Native Americans and witness a rip-roaring lumberjack competition on this comprehensive tour of Ketchikan. Your first stop will be a visit to Saxman Native Village. For generations, Tlingit villages have maintained a tradition of welcoming visitors in regal style. In this Native community, tribal elders and others have worked hard to pass on many of the traditions that have long defined their culture. A short video program will introduce you to their culture and history, then enter the Beaver Clan House where you'll be welcomed by song and dance. Visitors are encouraged to participate in the final dance before moving onto to the Saxman Totem Park, one of the largest gatherings of totem poles in the world.

The next stop is the Village Carving Center where world famous carvers work and pass on their skills to eager apprentices. Visit the Village Store to purchase some of the finest Native Alaska art available. On the return trip, see sights of Creek Street and let the fun begin with a stop at the Great Alaska Lumberjack Show. Hardy lumberjacks bring to live Alaska's colorful forest history with an action-packed competition in the partially covered and heated outdoor arena. Cheer on your team of world champion lumberjacks in events such as chopping, sawing, tree climbing and much more.

NOTES:

- Please note that there may be a short wait prior to the Lumberjack Show.
- Time can be spent on your own in the rustic company store located at the Lumberjack Show.

- Tour may operate in reverse.
- Maximum combined weight for guests with wheelchair is 500 lbs.
- Wear layered waterproof attire.
- Umbrellas available for guest comfort.
- Lift buses are not able to accommodate Motorized Scooters, however manual wheelchairs can be used.

KETCHIKAN HIGHLIGHTS BY TROLLEY

DETAILS:

Learn the history and culture of Ketchikan as you travel aboard a festive trolley. You'll be entertained by a lively city tour while passing by some of its most colorful landmarks. Travel through downtown Ketchikan and view the bustling boat harbors, lush City Park, and beautiful Ketchikan Creek. Next, you'll have an opportunity to stretch your legs on a brief photo and shopping stop.

Here you can photograph majestic totems up-close and shop at one of Ketchikan's finest stores to purchase authentic Native made items. Continue onto Creek Street, the historical red light district. Your trolley driver will offer you a return to the ship or you may leisurely enjoy the many shops and eateries of the downtown area and make your own way back.

NOTES:

- Wear layered waterproof clothing – umbrellas are available for use.
- Lift buses are unable to accommodate Motorize Scooters, however manual wheelchairs can be used.

Seattle, Washington

BEST OF SEATTLE WITH OBSERVATORY & AIRPORT TRANSFERS

DETAILS:

Enjoy sweeping 360° views of Seattle from the Sky View Observatory and take a closer look at the city icons once you descend. The observatory occupies the 73rd floor of the Columbia Center and is the highest public viewing area in the entire Pacific Northwest. From this lofty perch, you can easily spot the Great Wheel, the Space Needle – where you will stop later for photos – and the many parks that inspired Seattle’s nickname, the Emerald City. A driving tour through the urban landscape will reveal highlights such as the home sports stadiums for the Seattle Mariners and the Seahawks, the historical Chinatown-International District and Pioneer Square, where the city was founded in the 1850s. During free time at Pike Place Market, Seattle’s oldest and largest farmers market, you will get a genuine feel for daily life. Be sure to see the original Starbucks there before taking off for the airport.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Enjoy the ultimate view of Seattle and beyond from the soaring Sky View Observatory.
- Drive through historical neighborhoods as the guide describes landmark after landmark.
- Spend free time browsing the seemingly endless stalls in Pike Place Market.

HELPFUL HINTS:

- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

NOTES:

- This tour is only available for guests with flights after 3:00 pm for domestic and 4:00 pm for international departures.
